PLANNING COMMENCES FOR CLUBS 125 YEAR CELEBRATIONS

"The South Bendigo Football Club was formed at the Union Hotel, Golden Square in 1893; currently the site of the Union Hotel is a car park in the Golden Square shopping centre.

At the time of formation there was a Golden Square Junior Team but the whole area was south of Bendigo which probably accounts for the name South Bendigo being selected.

The colours of Red & White, worn by South Melbourne in the metropolitan area would have been selected as South Melbourne was a very successful team in the 1890's. Strange as it may sound considering they have only won three premierships since 1897 (V.F.L. Formation)

South probably gained the name the "Bloods" from the guernsey they wore before World War 1, a white guernsey with a red stripe, the reverse of their present style.'

"The Bloods" HIGHS AND LOWS OF 100 YEARS

Next year will mark 125 years since the formation of the Club in 1893. It is a long and distinguished period that has seen a considerable amount of success for the Bloods, both as a team and by individuals who have played in the red and white. 24 Premierships, the first in 1899 only 6 years after formation, would rank the Club amongst the more successful of country football clubs.

The Club is planning to recognise the rich history of the Bloods and celebrate the 125 year milestone with a series of events in 2018. Past player (and 3 time Premiership player) Stephen Dean is chairing the "125" Committee who are planning and organising the celebrations.

If you have any memorabilia or historical items relating to the club, either from your own personal experience with South Bendigo or from a member of your family's involvement over the years, we would love to hear from you. We are considering an update to the book on the history of the club (refer to the extract above) and possibly putting together a display of club memorabilia in our social rooms over the weekend of the 125 celebrations. PAST PLAYERS & OFFICIALS GROUP BEING RE-ENERGISED

Matters discussed to date have included developing a comprehensive contact list so that all past players and officials can be informed on current club activities and events. Potential social functions have been canvassed such as Thursday training nights where past players and officials would be encouraged to call in and have a drink while they watch training. Each Thursday at the conclusion of training players come into the rooms for a "training tea" and to hear the teams to be read out. A dinner, provided by our sponsors The Old Boundary Hotel, is available for only \$10 on these nights and it would provide a great opportunity for past and present players to meet.

This group of past players and officials is not a formal committee as such, rather a collection of people who are keen to see the club be successful. WHERE DOES SPORTS CHAPLAINCY FIT IN AT SOUTH

A question sporting communities often ask is: "Where does a sports chaplain fit into our club?"

Sporting clubs are wonderful communities but they are often quite complex because they're comprised of people from all walks of life. In one sense, they're like a family. Families have their good times and they also have their challenging times. And it's in these difficult moments that we often need some help and assistance from another. That's what a chaplain can do for a sporting community.

Sports Chaplains across Australia can provide a wide range of different services including:

- Club-wide care
- Personal support / mentoring
- Suicide and mental health awareness
- Grief, loss and bereavement care
- Marriage and relationship preparation
- Life skills support
- Critical Incident Response & Debriefs

From time to time, tragic events happen that rock sporting communities to their core. Sports Chaplains are trained to respond to critical incidents and can assist clubs in their times of grief and loss. A little over 12 months ago, I received a phone call to inform me that there had been a tragic death of a young girl connected to the Heathcote FNC. This club had contacted AFL Central Victoria looking for some help and could I come and provide some pastoral care and support to players and families. The following day, another chaplain and I spent the best part of 3-4 hours walking people through their pain and supporting them in their time of grief. While these moments are never easy, it is an incredible privilege to provide pastoral care and support to sporting communities in their time of need.

This is my third year as chaplain and I've really enjoyed getting to meet and know many different people connected to the "Bloods." This is a great sporting family and I'm looking forward to another great year around the club.

UNDER18's UPDATE FOR THE SEASON AHEAD

This season the under 18's are in a position that we haven't had for an extended period of time with overwhelming numbers (31 players on the list). We have retained 15 players from last year's side, had 10 players step up from the under 16's, and selective recruited 6 players into the club. We are certainly starting to see the benefits of the great work done over the past years focusing on the junior side of the club.

Training commenced all the way back in November with players joining the senior group up until Christmas with the playing group coming back together the second week in January. From there we have had exceptional numbers on the track as the players have worked extremely hard to build a solid fitness base for the 2017 season. Just recently we have focussed on our structures and processes as we look to bed these down over the coming 4 weeks ensuring we play an exciting, but disciplined brand of football.

Last weekend we played our annual practise match against a full strength Bell Park and the signs where pleasing. We had 10 players unavailable through cricket etc and managed to push a side that competes in an under 18.5 competition, being one of the strongest leagues in Victoria (went down by 5 points). Some standout performances last week where Alexander Smith-Ralph (recruited from Swan Hill), Brayden Sheahan, Will Pollard (recruited from Mount Pleasant), Mitch Goodwin (from the under 16's), Jack Hetherington (from the under 16's) and Ben McKinley.

This season the players are focussed on building on a competitive 2016 as we push to play finals football in 2017.

Junior Program Update

The junior program has been very busy since last October advertising and interviewing potential coaches and then finalising the appointments. The successful applicants were then instructed to commence working on 'list management' as even with junior teams now we simply can't afford to just turn up in February and see who and how many players each team has for the season.

Clubs who will be successful in the coming years at a senior level will be the ones who have worked hard on their junior program, supporting their junior coaches, managers and support staff and creating an enjoyable developmental environment which will in turn encourage junior players to want to play at South Bendigo.

This year the junior division will have our Youth Girls whose numbers this year have increased to approximately 20 at this stage and growing and as we all know with the AFLWL the pathways for girls in football has never been better and is a very exciting time. I would like to strongly encourage everyone at the club to get along to their games at some stage and support the coaches – Mark Taig, Emma Tomlins and Maddy Townsend and the girls.

The under 16's will have two teams this year under the guidance of myself as head coach and Mick Easton who will be coaching the Reserves team, Mick and I will be both be working closely with assistants Craig Osborne and Brendan Webb along with Manager Rob Robertson who is already doing an amazing job as usual.

The Under 14 team this year is being coached by former player Anthony Purcell, the Under 12 team will be coached by Dan Wright while also former player, coach and club legend Neville Clark will be in charge of the Under 10's. As a club we are extremely fortunate to have the expertise and commitment of all these people willing to give up their time to coach and develop all our future players.

This month Neville Clark and I along with the help of senior players Joel Swatton, Isaiah Miller, Adrian Coad, Zac Haire and under 18 player Kade Blow we have commenced the first round of primary school clinics starting at Spring Gully Primary. This series of clinics were held over three consecutive Fridays from 11.30-3.00pm and we took the grades 3, 4, 5 & 6 boys and girls through marking, kicking, handball and contact skills during these sessions, and judging by the smiles the kids all had a great experience. There is a number of sporting options for young people in this day and age but hopefully we have planted the seed for the ones not playing football to commence playing the game, if not this year maybe in the future and at South Bendigo. We have the next round of clinics scheduled at Kennington Primary and Quarry Hill Primary Schools. I strongly encourage all senior player to become involved when approached to help out, we must always remember how great it was when we were kids and senior players took the time to come to our school or to our training nights and passed on their knowledge.
