#### 2016 SEASON REVIEW

We were fortunate to see the return of Brady Childs to the club to take on the senior coaching role for season 2016. Whilst it was disappointing that a late season knee injury at his former club Shepparton Swans saw him unable to take the field as a playing coach, we felt it gave him more of an opportunity to hone his coaching skills without the added pressure of playing in his first season as coach which we believe lead to him developing rapidly as the season progressed, along with the young playing group.

We were also fortunate to gain the services of Bryce Balsille as Reserves Coach and Neale Torpey as our Under 18's Coach, completing a whole new coaching panel for season 2016.

We are pleased to confirm that Brady, Bryce and Neale have committed for the 2017 season.

The focus on the year was development and continued improvement and those objectives were met in all grades. It was also great to see a number of Under 18 players perform well in the Seniors. Whilst the seniors registered only 5 wins, the team were very competitive throughout the year, being in positions to win several more games with experience being the major factor. It was pleasing to finish the season with 3 straight wins and a great platform for season 2017.

Another pleasing aspect was the increase in depth at the club which saw our Reserves team make the finals. We were also very pleased with the progress of our Under 18 team. With most of the lads being bottom age players, they acquitted themselves very well to finish just outside the top 5.

On the Netball side of things it was fantastic to have two teams play off in the Grand Finals with B-Reserve taking out the Premiership and B Grade runner up in their division. Our congratulations go to the respective coaches Sally Sheehan and Kiralee Beecham, along with of course the players.

Our A and A Reserve teams did not have the season they were hoping for, however we were really pleased with the excellent job Benita Swatton did in taking over the reins just prior to the season starting and now has the opportunity to mould the side into a competitive unit for season 2017.

Whilst our Under 17 squad did not fare well on the win / loss ratio, their endeavor and commitment could not be questioned and the group is in excellent hands with our experienced development coach Liz Taylor.

With regard to our junior football and netball divisions we are very happy with the development and progress we are making as a club. The Junior Football and Netball Divisions lead by Gareth Tawton and Michelle Forrester who have both worked tirelessly along with their committees to ensure the smooth operation and quality standards across all levels of our junior program. A big thanks to all of our coaches, managers, volunteers and parents for your support.

We continue to see the progress of Harry Trott Oval with the Netball Courts to be ready for season 2017. This is very exciting for the club as we continue our progress to relocate fully to this venue over the next couple of years. We are currently in discussions with council and architects with regard to our new pavilion and social rooms which is the next step in the overall development.

Finally I would like to thank and acknowledge the fantastic group of volunteers we have at South Bendigo including our committee, along with the wonderful group who run our Bingo. It is very enjoyable and rewarding to mix with such a wonderful team and look forward to our progress into season 2017.

SOUTH Bendigo has set the goal of having all five of its netball teams playing in the Bendigo league finals next season. The Bloods this year won their first netball premiership for 16 years with their B reserve team and are hoping that can be a catalyst for more success on court in 2017. The first step in that process is confirming their coaching panel.

Coaching the A grade and A reserve sides will again be Benita Swatton, who joined the Bloods this year having previously coached at Strathfieldsaye and Heathcote. The Bloods' A grade side has plenty of work to do if it's to challenge for a spot in the top five next season after winning just four games – all against Castlemaine – the past two years.

In charge of the B grade and B reserve teams will be Kiralee Beacham. The B reserve team was the premiers this year after defeating Golden Square by three goals in the grand final. And combining the role of coach of the under-17s and the Bloods' development team will be Liz Taylor.

"Our ultimate goal is to have all grades sitting in the top five in 2017. We are under no illusions we have a lot of hard work ahead of us, but we are up for the challenge," Taylor said at the weekend.

#### 2017 BSNA Winter Season



# The Old Boundary Hotel

The Old Boundary Hotel is located on Milroy Street. Having been renovated inside it features a warm red brick interior with mining and gold rush memorabilia. Large red gum timber bars accompanied by high back stools await the thirsty ones. A variety of ales, both heavy and light are on tap.

#### BLOODS KEEN TO LAUNCH FROM POSITIVE FINISH

Reappointed South Bendigo coach Brady Childs is confident the Bloods can use their positive finish to the season as a springboard into next year. While the Bloods ended the BFNL season with just five wins – which was one more victory than 2015 – they won their last three games against Gisborne (33 points), Castlemaine (1) and Maryborough (77).

"The club hasn't had a lot of stability in recent years – I'm the fourth coach in three years – so to have that stability going into next season is a positive," Childs said. "We've already resigned 19 of this year's playing list, so we're well advanced on where we've been in recent years. "To finish the season with three wins in a row, which the club hadn't done since 2013, was a positive, and with a really exciting young list with an average age of 22 or 23 and having played five under-18 kids this year, we think it's an exciting time. "We know we're going to have to find a way to kick more goals, so we'll be out looking for forwards."

In making the reappointment, South Bendigo president Rick Townsend said Childs had grown into his coaching role well throughout the season. "He has been really good for the group, so we're looking forward to him continuing next year," Townsend said.

The Bloods will have co-captains next year, with Kieran Strachan to join veteran Aaron Connaughton as joint skipper. Strachan this year continued to build on his reputation as one of the emerging young guns of the BFNL, with the ruckman finishing equal fourth in the Michelsen Medal with 15 votes. Strachan was also named the ruckman in the *Bendigo Advertiser* Team of the Year. "With where we're at as a footy club, we're trying to really develop our younger guys, which includes leadership, so it's a great opportunity for Strachany to co-captain with Azza," Childs said. "Strachany has shown a lot in that area this year with his leadership capabilities, so we look forward to him continuing to develop next year."

The Bloods have also announced their first addition for next year, with Joel Swatton returning to the club after a year away in 2016 with university commitments. "Joel will add a lot back to us next year... he's stronger and fitter and ready to get back into it again," Childs said. Also keen to get back on the park in 2016 is Childs, who was forced to coach from the sidelines this year following a knee reconstruction. "I've got the all-clear from the surgeon that everything is fine, so I'm looking forward to stepping things up and getting fit again," Childs said. And after missing the last seven games this year with a torn medial, Connaughton says he will be right to go from round one next season.

#### GVFL GOALSNEAK KAIDEN ANTONOWICZ SIGNS WITH BLOODS

SOUTH Bendigo has taken the first step in addressing its goal kicking deficiency by adding Goulburn Valley league premiership player Kaiden Antonowicz. Antonowicz joins the Bloods for the 2017 Bendigo Football-Netball League season from the Shepparton Swans.

The 22-year-old is a 2014 Swans' premiership team-mate of South Bendigo coach Brady Childs who has kicked tallies of 40, 43, 36 and 43 goals over the past four seasons. "Brady and I played in a premiership together at the Swans, so that was a big attraction to coming here," Antonowicz said on Friday. "We were part of a rebuild at the Swans and it's exciting to be part of another one here." Antonowicz – a La Trobe University education student – is also a former Murray Bushranger, kicking 33 goals in the TAC Cup in 2012, and was an emergency for the GVFL's inter-league team earlier this year.

The Bloods, who won five games in 2016 and haven't played finals since 2012, have bolstering their forward line as one of their top priorities over the off-season. Only Leroy Miller (23) kicked more than 20 goals this season, while the Bloods' average scores of 70 ranked 8<sup>th</sup> in the BFNL.

"We were pretty good defensively and through the midfield this year, but we need more forwards," Childs said. "We struggled to kick more than 10 goals in a game, so bringing in Kaiden, who is a proven performer in the GVFL, is going to be a positive for us. "But it's also about recruiting really good people and Kaiden brings that to the club as well. "Even though he's still only young himself, he brings a lot of experience in terms of how the Shepparton Swans went about it." Antonowicz joins the Bloods as a three-point player.

South Bendigo also has midfielder Joel Swatton returning to the club in 2017, Childs will be back on the park after being sidelined this year following a knee reconstruction, while the Bloods have also added White Hills' Tom Brereton, Golden Square's Regan Harvey and Koondrook-Barham's Zac Hare to their list.

The Bloods will kick off their pre-season training at Harry Trott Oval on Monday, November 21.
