ANNUAL SPORTS LUNCH IS ATTRACTING A LOT OF INTEREST.

The club is holding its' annual sports luncheon on the 23rd of this month, coinciding with our home game against Golden Square at the QEO. This event is a major annual fundraiser for the club as well as an opportunity to host and thank the sponsors of our club.

We have been very fortunate over the years to have attracted a range of outstanding sports people as guest speakers at our annual luncheon and this year is no exception with AFL great and media personality Robert DiPierdomenico. "Dipper" is a legend of the game, playing more than 200 games in a decorated career with Hawthorn culminating in 5 Day and 5 Night Premierships, 1986 Brownlow Medallist, and being inducted into the AFL Hall of Fame in 2007.

Joining the "Hall of Famer" as a speaker on the day will be controversial sports scientist Stephen Dank. Mr Dank has emerged as one of the key figures in the recent controversial issue of drugs in sport and the Essendon Football Club saga. His presentation will provide a great opportunity to hear firsthand one side of the biggest story in recent football history.

When the engagement of Mr Dank was first announced it generated some controversy and a good level of public interest about town. The Club reiterates its position which we made clear at the time and that is in engaging Mr Dank as a speaker we are neither condemning nor condoning his reported involvement in the sports supplements controversies. HARRY TROTT OVAL UPDATE

There has been further movement in regard to our relocation to Harry Trott Oval. The City of Greater Bendigo has advised that they are in the process of finalising the appointment of the architect to complete the design for a new pavilion at Kennington Recreation Reserve.

The city have also arranged a joint i.e. South Bendigo FNC and Bendigo United Cricket Club, site visit to the new Kangaroo Flat Pavilion to discuss our individual club requirements while inspecting the new social room space that they have recently built there.

The City is also putting in a submission for funding to construct the pavilion to the State Government via the Community Sports Infrastructure Fund for the 2017-2018 funding round, Major Facilities. The first step in this process was to submit an expression of interest for the project which has been done. The Council will be notified whether the project proposal is successful to go to a full submission from 18 July and onwards, with final full proposals due 31 August. The overall estimated construction budget is \$2.2 million.

PREMIERSHIP REUNION #1

25 years after The Bloods had all 3 sides play off in the 1991 Bendigo Football League Grand Finals, when both our Senior and Under 18 teams won Premiership honours, the club hosted a reunion of past players and officials to recognise their achievements.

While the weekend started with many renewing acquaintances over pre-reunion drinks at our good sponsors The Old Boundary Hotel on the Friday night the main affair was held on Saturday 4th June at Harry Trott Oval, when the current day Bloods played Castlemaine. A poor first half by our boys mean the successes of 1991 could not be repeated on the field however the team had a much better second half to outplay the visitors and show the potential of the present day side.

Following the match the past players were transported back to our QEO Social Rooms where a collection of newspaper highlights from 1991 and the premiership pennants were on display to recall their achievements 25 years earlier.

It was tremendous to have so many past players from one of South Bendigo's greatest eras all back at the club. It was a great weekend, enjoyed by all in attendance. Common conversation themes were around fond memories of time at South Bendigo and enduring friendships. We hope that in the future they all stay connected with the club, return on a regular basis and maybe even continue to support the Bloods through an annual membership.

PREMIERSHIP REUNION #2

It is now 60 years since a record crowd of 15,000 watched South Bendigo 9.19:79 defeat Eaglehawk 9.15:69 to make it 3 in a row for the Bloods.

The side's Captain and Coach was Alan McDonald, a Club legend. "The Fox" as he was known, was one of South's most successful coaches, guiding the Bloods to five premierships from 1950-56. Not only was he coach of the most successful side in the club's history, but he also played, notching his 200th game in the 1956 Grand Final. Soon afterwards, McDonald was appointed coach of Richmond, a post he held for four seasons.

To recognise these legends from the Clubs greatest era we are holding a reunion of the 1956 side, in conjunction with our Life members lunch, on Saturday 13th of August.

Remarkably we have been able to track down 12 of the players from that premiership side as well as one of the playing group who was named as the emergency on the day. Sadly with the passing of time a number of the players are no longer with us. The following past players have all been contacted & advised of the reunion:
