

Following a very good day against Kangaroo Flat, both on the field and on the court, players, dressed in their very best, joined members and supporters for a most enjoyable social occasion.














RURAL CHALLENGE PROJECT

The Club recently took part in the "Rural Challenge Project". The challenge was a series of workshops that aimed to assist to strengthen the capabilities of leaders from football and netball clubs to actively promote gender equality and the prevention of violence against women. The clubs involved developed gender equality action plans that when implemented will assist clubs to be more female and family friendly.

AFL Central Victoria partnered with Macedon Rangers Shire Council, City of Greater Bendigo, Women's Health Loddon Mallee, and the CFA District 2 to deliver the project that was funded by the Victorian Government's Community Partnerships for Primary Prevention Program.

An outcome of the program was the development of goals under our Gender Equality Action Plan for the club to address a range of issues in areas such as Facilities, Governance & Leadership, Participation Opportunities, Promotion & Member Recruitment as well as Social Activities all of which will assist in establishing and maintaining a culture of equity and inclusion for women and families at our club.

SENIORS UPDATE

Currently, the seniors are sitting in 5th position with 6 wins and 4 losses, a great effort to this point given last season we had only 5 wins in total. Unfortunately the last month has seen 3 losses and only the one win.

Round 7 Vs Golden Square was a tight game, where Golden Square played well on their home turf and restricted our running game on the smaller oval through a full ground press. To the boys credit we fought right to the end to go down by 9 points. The biggest loss was another major injury with Joel Swatton fracturing his ankle in a tackle. Best players were Zac Hare, who was very solid in defence, Isaiah Miller who continued his great form in the midfield and Brad Wright who, as usual, competed well deep in defence.

Round 8 Vs Strathfieldsaye was a disappointing day for the seniors. Strathfieldsaye proved why they are currently sitting on top of the ladder with their ability to win the contested footy and then handle the ball cleanly on the outside. We did have plenty of opportunities and fought the game out, however it was a day of too many missed skills and a lack of pressure. Best players were Mitch Rogerson who won plenty of the ball and as usual was very efficient with his ball use, Nick Howe who competed all day against Lachy Sharp while also provided a lot of drive, and Alex Hywood, who's contested footy and effort was a highlight.

Round 9 Vs Kangaroo Flat saw the bloods return to the winning list. As a coach it's always a worry in the lead up to a game before the Annual Ball, but to the boys credit they were well focussed and keen to celebrate the night following a win. It was a great effort considering we lost 2 players early in the game, to run out 77 point winners. Best players were Blair Whelan, who was again a workhorse in the midfield, Mitch Hocking in his first senior game this season who showed off his running game and Liam Bartels, who kicked 5 goals from the midfield and was supposedly being heavily tagged!!!

Round 10 Vs Eaglehawk as a tough 21 point loss, and the boys all showed their disappointment. We didn't play our best football but fought the game out well and at stages looked very dangerous with our running game. We got within 4 points in the final quarter, but in the end it was Eaglehawks key forward Matt Gretrix who was the difference with 8 of their 13 majors, including a number from one handed grabs. Best players were Liam Bartels, who continued his hot form and continued to break the lines, Kieran Strachan who dominated the ruck all day, and Azza Connaughton who lead the way with his intensity and effort at the contest.

As coaches and playing group we have put ourselves in a terrific position leading into the final 8 rounds. It's a credit that the guys who are still competing extremely well against the top sides, given our depth is currently being tested with a number of seniors on the sideline through injury, while we are also somewhat off our best footy. It's an exciting month ahead for the senior side to push our way back up into the top 3, so I encourage everyone to get along and support us, as it doesn't go unnoticed and helps drive the boys.

RESERVES

<u>Vs Strathfieldsaye</u> Strathfieldsaye came out firing and kicked the first five goals of the game and we were slow to react and really did not fire a shoot in the first half. After half time the side showed a renewed vigour and the grit we know they are capable of and came right back. We were within 10 points when we lost 8 minutes to a season ending injury for James Oliver and fell just short of pulling off a win against a very good side. Mitch Hocking provided incredible run and carry on the swimming pool side wing of the QEO which saw him elevated to the seniors a week later, Andy Van Heuman has really found his niche at CHB and Cam Taggert is consistently impressing with his run and crumbing.

<u>Vs Kangaroo Flat</u> The game was a scrappy affair, with our diminishing numbers our skills have dropped away which is hurting us with poor turn over's. However our guys were way ahead all day and were never seriously challenged. Ex Flat boy Nathan Newlan showed his old club his metal in a best on game, big Jim Pietromonaco played, arguably, his best game at the club kicking four but having a hand in another 6 and proving leadership and a force up front and Ollie Dexter worked tirelessly at CHF and as a part time ruckman.

<u>Vs Eaglehawk</u> Our guys were under manned and had a really poor day at the office unfortunately. We butchered our possessions and only ran one way and the score reflected the way we played. We had two under 18's come up in Tom Fillery and Harley Turner and both acquitted themselves in a way that the club can be proud of, Tom strong in key positions and classy Harley kicking two goals. Chris Innes had a real go through the middle and generated a number of clearances, Cam Taggert continued his consistency and covered many miles on his wing and worked very hard. Andy Van Heuman rucked for all 4 quarters against formidable ruck opposition.

We are hopeful of the return of some players post bye, but we first face off against 4th placed Gisborne at Kennington this week which we will fight hard to win the 4 points. Our Full Forward James Pietromonaco is providing a strong target and sits 3rd on the league goal kicking ladder currently with approximately 30 providing a good under study to the senior key lead up forwards.

Some leaders of the group have taken it upon themselves to add a makeup session and lift the training rate to do a little more to improve their fitness and game, this is impressive and if they manage to drag some more team mates along to adopt the same level of commitment in the remaining 8 games, then I really feel this will be a hard team to stop in a finals campaign.
