#### NATHAN HORBURY



The Club is very pleased to advise that our Senior Coach Nathan Horbury has agreed to continue in the role for the next two years signing on for the 2020 and 2021 seasons.

The club has formed a recruitment committee under the chairmanship of Trevor Wright with the objective of strategically adding to our playing group to improve on field performance. The first critical step in this strategy was to secure a long term commitment from a quality coach who could attract good players to the club and Nathan fills this role perfectly.

Despite our mediocre record so far in 2019, due largely to a horrendous run with injury that having 38 players play a senior game by the halfway mark of the season emphasises, Nathan has still been able to get some good football and some readily identifiable individual improvement out of a very young "crop" of players. While not under the most ideal of circumstances, the opportunity to get several games of senior football into a group of 18 to 20 year old's so early in their careers can only be beneficial down the track when they can be supported on field through some targeted recruitment.

Despite the lack of wins Nathan has the playing group up and about with good numbers at training (when injuries permit) and really enjoying their football. Nathan's performance in his first year of coaching with the Bloods is not only recognised inside the club but is also acknowledged across the league with Nathan being awarded the AFLCV, CoachAFL, Gallery Café and Advanced High Performance Coach of the Month for June. A worthy recognition for the job he has done under challenging circumstances.








As well as his contribution as coach Nathan has also had an outstanding year as a player, consistently being amongst the teams best and continuously leading by example on field. Again, this is not just a biased internal club view but one shared by the broader football community with selection in the Bendigo FNL representative side and in the Vic Country team that defeated the VAFA side in the 2019 Brian Molony Cup bearing testament.

The South Bendigo family were saddened to hear of the passing of past player John Waddington last month. John played in the red and white back in the 1950's and was the Bendigo Football Leagues Leading Goal Kicker, with 72 goals in 1957.

John was recruited to North Melbourne in 1958 where he played 132 senior games for the club. While John played VFL predominantly as a defender he still managed to kick 30 goals across his VFL career, including 3 in a semi final win by the Kangaroos over Fitzroy.


