

#### **GARY COWLING AWARDED RETROSPECTIVE 1979 MICHELSEN MEDAL**

The Bendigo Football Netball League can confirm a recent submission by the South Bendigo FNC on behalf of the family of the late Gary Cowling was received, to request consideration to amend the outcome of the tied 1979 Michelsen Medal.


The SBFNC submitted extensive research and supporting evidence, clearly documenting the result of the 1979 Michelsen Medal count, including the initial three-way tie, with the result determined under a "countback" system at the time, a system which is no longer implemented by the League.

Peter Tyack (Sandhurst)\* and Eric Pascoe (Golden Square) were announced as joint winners on the night, eventually determined by a countback following an initial 3-way tie including Gary Cowling (South Bendigo).

Based upon the extensive evidence presented, in conjunction with further research undertaken by the League and in accordance with current BFNL by-laws, the BFNL Board have approved the request to award Gary Cowling of the South Bendigo FNC, a retrospective 1979 Michelsen Medal. League records will be updated to document the 1979 result as a three-way tie between Peter Tyack (Sandhurst), Eric Pascoe (Golden Square) and Gary Cowling (South Bendigo), including notation of this successful submission.

The BFNL also confirmed such consideration of amendments to any historic league award outcome would only occur for senior league competitions. This includes the prestigious Michelsen Medal senior football award, with only records dating back to 1952 being considered, at which time the award was renamed and referred to as the Michelsen Medal.

The League will invite the family of the late Gary Cowling to accept the award on his behalf at the 2021 Michelsen Medal awards ceremony, scheduled for September 2021.

#### A WORD FROM OUR CHAPLAIN

Us Aussies are an active bunch with an estimated 14.4 million people participating in some form of exercise, recreational or sporting activity each year. We love our sport and many of us find a rich sense of community within the various sporting clubs or groups in which we associate with.

Where does Sports Chaplaincy fit in all of this?

Sports Chaplaincy Australia (SCA) was established in 1984 and today has over 400 chaplains serving as volunteers in local and high-performance sports across Australia. Some chaplains also serve in critical incident sports such as Motor Racing, Surf Lifesaving and Horse Racing. The Bendigo Football League currently has several chaplains serving across the league.

People often ask me what a chaplain does at a sporting club. The simple answer is we "loiter with intent." Sporting clubs are full of ordinary people who at various times face some extraordinary problems. Sports chaplains are trained to provide genuine pastoral care and support for the members of their sporting communities in their time of need. We help clubs by providing a range of services such as:

- Mentoring
- Suicide awareness
- Stress management support
- Crisis management and recovery services
- Home and hospital visitations
- Grief, loss and bereavement care
- Family care and general support

I've been serving as the chaplain at South Bendigo FNC for several years and it's been a real pleasure to meet many different people as well as provide some of the different services listed above. A couple of years ago, the club decided to extend its care to our junior football teams by adding Chris Thornton to the volunteer chaplaincy team. #### **NETBALL**



The netballers have been in full swing for pre-season in 2021 with the first, full squad, training session undertaken in mid-January. after squads were finalised in November 2020. The girls have commenced an 8-week Bootcamp of a Tuesday night, with 'The Bunker HQ' which focusses on strength and conditioning and overall improvement of fitness. The Bunker HQ team, formally known as Original Bootcamp, have supported the South Bendigo Netballers over previous years throughout pre-season, which have generated great results. Alongside bootcamp, the girls are back to some 'normality' on the court of a Thursday night after year that was 2020.

On Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> of February, our annual netball pre-season camp was undertaken at the QEO for the whole netball squad. These camp days are well organised by our coaches and operations manager of netball which while having a netball focus aim to improve confidence and build connections amongst our players both as individuals and as a squad. Our day started off with a netball focussed court session in the morning, followed by a dance and cheerleading class lead by 'Jennifer from ZFit Studios', which saw our girls working in groups and performing cheerleading style lifts.

By far the highlight of the day was our spectacular guest speaker Jacqui Cooper, Jacqui is a former five-time Australian Olympic Aerial Skier and spent time talking the girls through her stella career which also seen her face and overcome many injuries to have an amazing comeback to the sport and continue life post professional sport with her own family. Jacqui demonstrated several qualities that resonate with team sports but was also



inspirational to listen to, providing great life strategies the girls can apply to their toolboxes for the making of champions, both on and off the court.



After lunch, the girls were led by Coach Elizabeth Taylor for a sprint session, followed by a Pilates Class to finish the day. This was led by physiotherapist from 3D Studios, Molly Johnston, former A Grade South Netballer.

#### JUNIOR NETBALL

Welcome to season 2021.

The Junior Committee hope that everyone has enjoyed some well-earned rest and relaxation over the Christmas / New Year period.

The Committee has been very busy over the last few weeks with our Open section players returning to the courts for grading sessions! It has been great to catch up with new and returning players and we are excited to be back on the courts.

At the time of writing, our Section 1, 2, 3 and 4 grading processes have been completed with the 13/Under section to be completed in the next couple of weeks.

This year we have taken a slightly different approach to grading given most of our players have not played much netball in the last 12 months. Up to four training sessions have been run over the last few weeks, much like an ordinary training session. The difference being our coaches spent considerable time taking evaluation notes. We then conducted a final grading session where independent selectors graded our players into teams.

We were very fortunate to have some great selectors help us out during the final session including Jade Heinrich from Inspire Sports, Nicole Donnellon - AFLCV Academy and 17/U coach, Jan Mannes - AFL Central Vic and BSNA Coordinator, ex gun Senior players and all round champions of the Club Mel Dillon and Emma Tomlins as well as our coaches who don't have children participating in the division to be graded. To ensure our grading process is fair and transparent the Committee have no part in the selection process except to ensure the sessions run smoothly.

Our **primary teams** are yet to start training, but it won't be too long before they will be back running around the courts. Coaches will be in contact within the next few weeks to introduce themselves with a return to training likely to be mid to late March for the older primary teams and early April for the younger primary teams. #### **Volunteers**

Once grading and teams are finalised, we will be looking for volunteers to undertake the Team Manager and Carer roles for each team. The Team Manager role is best described as the team contact. They send out a reminder note on team app each week advising of the game time, who's on fruit, etc. they look after the kit bag and ensure some tasks are completed, for eg. votes. The Team Carer position helps the team during game time should someone be injured or require assistance. If you can help in either of these roles, then please let the coach know.

#### **BSNA/VNA** Registration

BSNA/VNA Registration is now due and payable. All fees MUST be paid by 3 March 2021 and anyone with unpaid fees will **NOT** be allowed to take the court once competition begins.

#### **FOOTBALL**




We are looking forward to the 2021 season with high expectations as we have been fortunate to maintain nearly all of our senior football list from 2019. This playing group largely comprises of a wealth of younger players who have now played 2-3 seasons such as Mitch Goodwin, Will Tobin and Braydon Torpey along with proven senior footballers in dual Club B&F winner Brody Haddow, Tom Brereton, Ron Best Medallist Kaidon Antonowitz and Brock Harvey. This strong squad will be further strengthened with a number of players returning from long term injuries such as Daniel Nalder, Zac Hare and Will Keck.

Additionally, the recruitment of Michael Herlihy from Murray football league, Oli Simpson, Oscar White, Cooper Leon and Sunny Brazier from the Amateurs, provide some additional experience of footy at a high level. Whilst our U18s only played the one game last season due to the Covid shutdown, there are expectations that young players such as Tom St Clair, Wil McCaig, Kyle Simpkins and Will Crane will come under serious consideration as they move up into the senior ranks this year.

Unfortunately, due to increased work commitments Club legend Peter Tyack was not in a position to carry on as our Under 18's coach this year. A letter was sent out to all past players last month seeking expressions of interest and while there were some offers of help, nobody has put their hand up to take on this most important role at our club. A great deal of support is available to put around the position to assist a new appointee and if anybody is now in a position to reconsider it would be great to hear from you.

Regrettably with this key position remaining unfilled so far, the ranks of our Under 18 players are very thin and likely to remain that way until the vacancy is filled. Strong underage ranks are critical in the "grow your own" approach necessary under the points system. If you are aware of any young footballer either looking for a club or perhaps unhappy where they currently are you should let them know that we are looking for more Under 18 players this season.

#### WHY VOLUNTEERING IS GOOD FOR YOUR MENTAL HEALTH

The current off field team at the Bloods, both at Senior and Junior levels, have some very talented and hard working people but they could all do with some extra support to lighten the load and make their participation with the club far more enjoyable. The following article from TIME USA magazine shows why putting up your hand to help out at the Bloods can be beneficial to both yourself and your club.

"Volunteering is good for your mental health, especially in middle age and beyond, according to a new study.

The report, published in the journal BMJ Open, surveyed people living in 5,000 households in Great Britain over several years. About 20% of the people surveyed said they volunteered.

On a questionnaire that measured mental health and wellbeing—where lower scores were considered healthier—people who volunteered scored about 10.7, compared to the average score of 11.4 among people who didn't volunteer. Volunteering may "provide a sense of purpose," the researchers write in the study, while helping maintain social networks that are critical as people age.

Interestingly, people in the 40 and older groups appeared to have the greatest health benefit from the practice. The effect increased as people got older, and it was more robust among people who said they volunteered frequently compared to people who volunteered less often. "One explanation might be that during younger ages, volunteering may be perceived of as yet another obligatory task to fulfill in order to be a good student, parent, worker and so forth, so it does not have beneficial effects on health," the researchers suggest.

The study is not the first to link volunteering to better health. Other research has suggested that people over age 50 who volunteer regularly are less likely to develop high blood pressure than non-volunteers".


