A wise man by the name of Solomon once said, "I have seen something else under the sun: The race is not to the swift or the battle to the strong, nor does food come to the wise, or wealth to the brilliant or favour to the learned: but time and chance happen to them all."

Any sports enthusiast will be aware of the thrill of victory and the agony of defeat. Some athletes work hard and experience the heights of success while others; they do the same amount of training but miss out on the glory and fame of success. Australia's efforts in the recent World Cup are a great example of this. Each of these Socceroos has worked hard over the past four years and yet the joy of making it through these recent qualifying rounds into the Top 16 has eluded them once again. The experience of the Socceroos echoes the wise words of Solomon – one can train endlessly, eat well, get sponsored, and know one's sport, but with no guarantees of success.

A few years ago I was training and preparing for the half marathon in Melbourne. I'd done all the hard work in preparation and about three weeks out from the race I tweaked my hamstring while running preventing me from participating in the race. I was so disappointed knowing that this race was gone and I was going to have to watch from the sidelines.

As athletes, we can do all the right things with no guarantee of success. Are you feeling as if life is not going as expected? That your hard work isn't paying off? Solomon reminds us that troubles will come and go, as that's a part of life. So in the end, it's what you do in the midst of trouble that really matters the most in life.

Vince Lombardi, a famous NFL player and coach of the Green Bay Packers, had some wise advice for tough times. Having experienced both the thrill of victory and the agony of defeat, he said, "It's not whether you get knocked down..." that matters, but rather "...it's whether you get up." What matters most in life is getting up and trying again.

Let's enjoy our sport. Let's make sure that we don't allow our victories or our defeats to define us. And if we're getting knocked around, let's make sure we keep getting up and trying again.

Topics covered included self-esteem, popularity, respect, peer pressure and the importance of listening to the right voices.

Through selection in the squad Torpey has been recognised as being amongst the top community football talent from across the state and will have the chance to don the representative jumper in the 2018 AFL Victoria Under 19 challenge Cup.

Brayden's transition to the backline this year has seen him play some very good football in the Bloods senior side. A first rate user of the ball his left foot has created numerous opportunities for the Bloods coming out of the backline this season.

Damian Sexton will lead the next generation of country Victoria talent as coach of the Under 19 Energy Safe Vic Country squad for the tenth consecutive year.

Goulburn Valley League has secured the most selections in the initial Under 19 squad with nine players, followed by Ovens & Murray Football League and Geelong Football League with eight representatives each.

The Under 19 squad will look to claim its fifth consecutive win over VAFA, after securing a tight four point win over VAFA at Frankston Oval last year.

The Vic Country vs. Vic Metro showdown will be held at Ballarat's Mars Stadium on Sunday July 8, with the Under 19 Challenge kicking off at 11:30am, followed by the seniors at 2:00pm.

The initial squads will conduct training sessions in mid-June, with the final squads to be released in the lead up to the 2018 AFL Victoria Community Championships.

Kieran remains a South Bendigo player and when not required for VFL duties will be available for selection with the Bloods. Borough Sign Young Ruckman Kieran Strachan

The Port Melbourne Football Club are pleased to announce the signing of young ruckman Kieran Strachan. Strachan is a 22-year-old, 202 centimetre ruckman initially from South Bendigo who has most recently been on Essendon's VFL list.

With a heavy artillery of AFL-listed personnel to choose from each week for the Bombers, Strachan was often an unfortunate 'victim of circumstance' when it came to earning a spot despite an obvious amount of raw ability and consistently-strong performances with his home club South Bendigo. Strachan has only played 4 VFL games since joining the Bombers VFL List in 2017 which included being named in the Best Players following a 16-disposal, 8-mark (5 contested) and 4-tackle match last year.

Strachan won two consecutive best and fairests with the 'Bloods' in 2015/16 and has been on the radar of several AFL clubs having also tested at the AFL Combine last year. So far this season, Strachan has put together 7 games with South Bendigo and even managed to sneak forward to boot 9 goals.

With Premiership ruckman Lachie Waddell currently sidelined with a foot injury, Borough fans can possibly expect to see Strachan play a role within the engine room over the next few weeks. Strachan will officially wear jumper number 50 for the Borough.

From a list change point of view, Strachan officially replaces Wade Donnan who will be put on the club's supplementary list as he returns from recent injury setbacks.
