"STAND UP" TRAINING SESSION

The Club's leadership groups, both on and off field, recently went through a training session conducted by Women's Health Loddon Mallee called "Stand Up" which provided lessons on promoting equality and respect within sports clubs and the value in making the club both family and female friendly.

Sporting clubs can play an important role in creating an environment that is safe and respectful for both females and males. A key part of creating a safe and inclusive club is to equip all club members to 'stand up' when they see or hear about sexist language, sex discrimination or sexual harassment taking place. 'Standing Up' can take many forms and is often referred to as 'bystander action'. It can include speaking up against sexist or disparaging language or jokes where safe to do so or identifying and changing club practices and policies that discriminate against women.

Stand Up is a session for sporting clubs that promotes gender equality and empowers participants with the tools to challenge attitudes, beliefs and behaviours that sustain gender based violence. Stand Up recognises the significant influence that sporting clubs have in promoting gender equality.

The session covered:

- The importance of leadership in preventing violence and promoting gender equality;
- How to be an active bystander;
- How your club can be safe and inclusive for women and girls;
- The link between violence against women and gender equality.

Conducting the session was one of the actions identified in the Clubs Gender Equality Action Plan

CIRCUIT BREAKER

'Sorry, I missed that. Could you repeat that?' or 'I'm not sure what you mean?'

'How would you feel if that was your sister, mother or daughter being talked about?' or 'I'd be offended if someone said that about my daughter'.

"I" LANGUAGE

Use 'I' instead of 'you' so they don't get defensive. 'l'm not really comfortable with what you said'.

RECRUIT OTHERS

You're probably not the only one who thinks that the behaviour was out of line. Say something like:

'Am I only the one uncomfortable about this?'

CHAT

Talk to the person about what they said in private or talk to a club leader.





1 - TIME KEEPERS & SCOREBOARD OPERATORS

The club is looking to recruit and train a couple of extra people in the roles of Time Keeper and Scoreboard Operators.

Both roles are carried out in the time keepers box adjacent to the Grandstand with the scoreboard being operated remotely via a lap top computer from there as well.

The scoreboard operator role is required for home games only while the club needs to provide a time keeper for both home and away games. Having 2 or 3 trained for each job means that there is flexibility in the role, you are not locked into every weekend and the roles can even be split across each game on match day.

Watching the footy from an elevated seat, behind glass in a heated room with afternoon tea thrown in. It's like having your own super box!





2 - BAR STAFF SOCIAL ROOMS

The South Bendigo Social Rooms at the QEO have been a big asset for the club over many years. In addition to being a great facility for club gatherings and social events they also provide the club with an opportunity to raise money through the hire of the venue for external functions. The club maximises the revenue opportunities the Social Rooms provide by running these external functions wholly with volunteers. Unfortunately, as with many things, this responsibility is starting to fall onto fewer willing workers.

In line with the principle that "many hands make light work" the club is looking for expressions of interest from people who would be able to help out serving behind the bar and/or generally assisting at these functions from time to time. No experience is necessary, and you won't be locked into any roster. Emails go out requesting assistance the month before and if you're available then great, if not, well then maybe next time. It's not an onerous task and often can be a lot of fun.

NEW ON FIELD FOOTBALL LEADERSHIP IN 2018

Due to a retirement and probable AFL commitments with Essendon this season both of last year's Co-Captains, Aaron Connaughton and Kieran Strachan, have passed on the Senior Football Captain baton and on field leadership role to Brad Wright for Season 2018.

Following 2 x Best and Fairest years at the Bloods in 2015 and 2016 Kieran Strachan made Essendon's AFL list last year. Another good season with South last year as well as a couple of prominent displays at AFL level again see's Kieran listed with the Bombers and likely to make more appearances for them in 2018. Kieran has been named as a Vice Captain for the Bloods this year.

After 150 plus senior games with South Bendigo, the last 3 years as Club Captain and 5 years at AFL level with the Bendigo Bombers Aaron Connaughton has decided to retire.

Aaron has provided the following message as a thank you to all at South Bendigo FNC

"I have decided to retire at the ripe old age of 34. To be honest I have lost the drive and motivation to compete and pull the jumper on for another year. It's been something I've been doing now for the good part of 16 years, and even before that through the SBFC & Pioneers junior programs.

I'm just not enjoying it as much as I was in the past and as I'm finding out that priorities shift as you get older. I still love the game, but I feel that's there's other paths for me to take at this stage in my life (i.e. Business & Family). Obviously with a young family and the new business, I just can't make the commitment required to play senior football.

South Bendigo Football Club is and always will be part of my DNA, and I'm thankful for all the support I've received along the way, from my team-mates, coaches and club staff, my family and friends, and from the amazing bloods supporters.

It has been an honour to captain the club for the last three seasons, and I'll step away satisfied I gave it everything I possibly could. The club and playing list is looking really healthy, and I can't wait to see the boys take the competition on and be a real contender this year."
