## NETBALL *Round 9 v Eaglehawk*

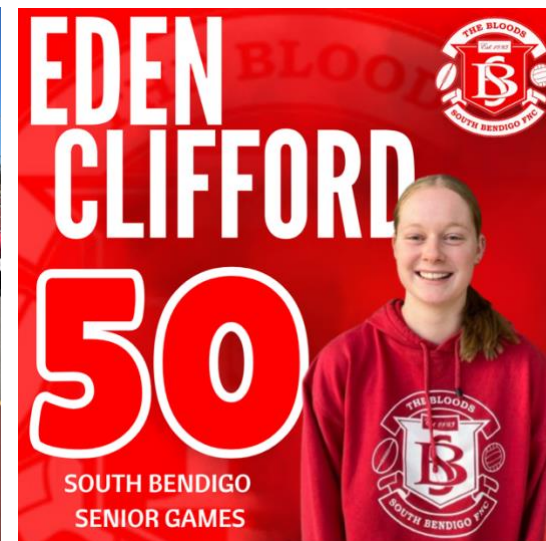

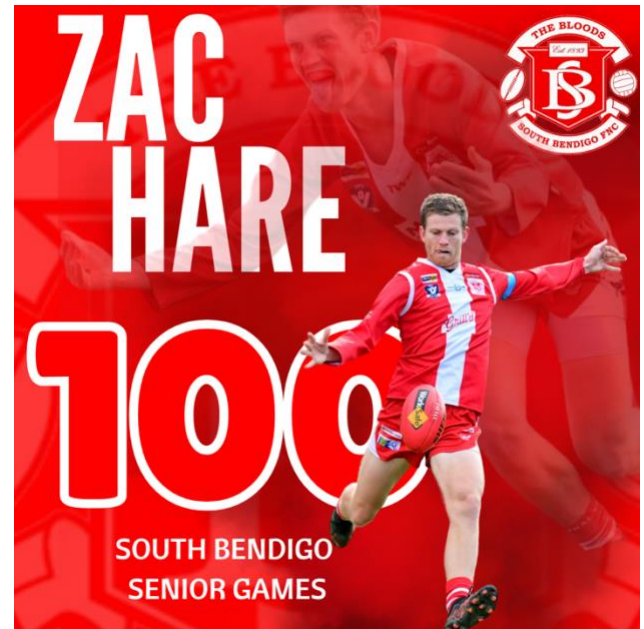


## FOOTBALL *Round 11 v Castlemaine*

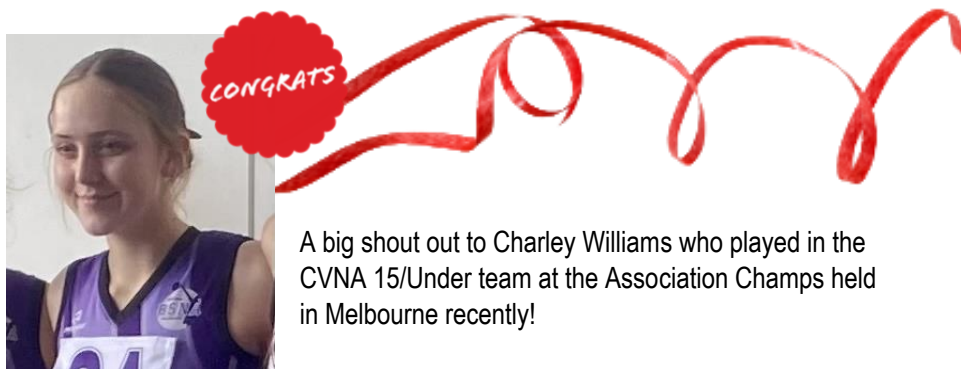

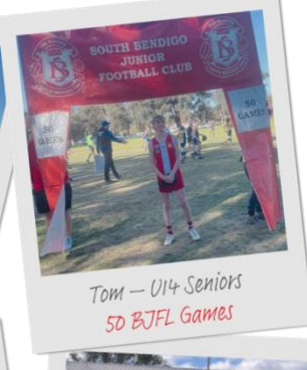
