NETBALL *Round 14 v Sandhurst*

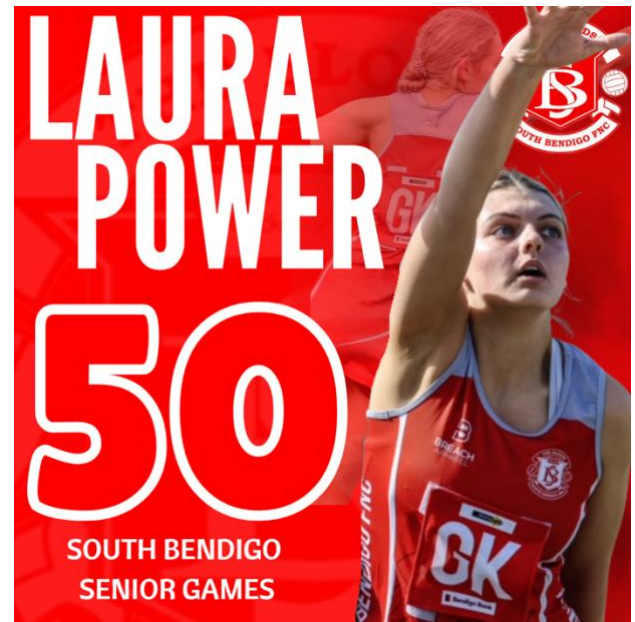

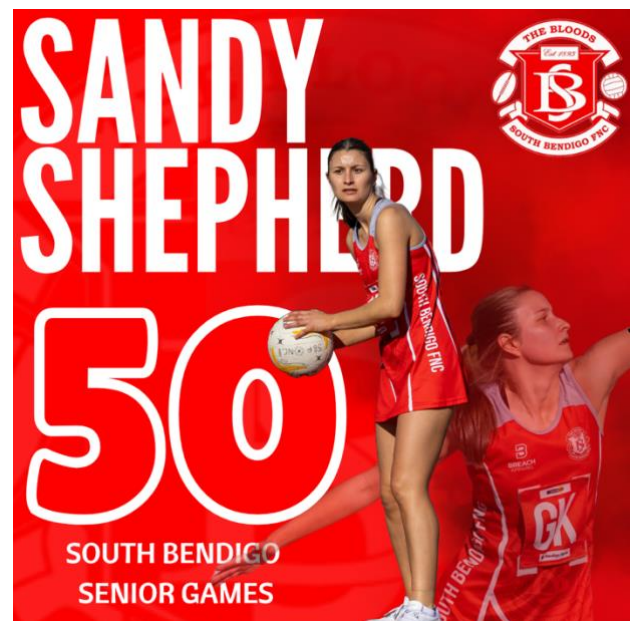

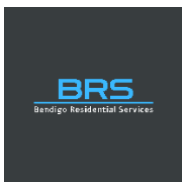
